## ***Nevada goes ELT***

Nevada will soon join the ELT world.

The Nevada Electronic Lien and Title (ELT) program will be implemented late September 2015.

Nevada Statute calls for phased participation in the ELT program:

- ✓ Participation is voluntary for the first 12 months
- ✓ Months 13-24, lienholders doing 27 or more liens per calendar year will be required to participate
- ✓ After 24 months, ELT will be mandatory for all lenders normally engaged in the business or practice of financing vehicles

In partnership with Nevada DMV, eDS will be the official HUB for the NV ELT program and maintain participation and daily activity of all electronic transaction transmission. Lenders will be required to sign up with an approved Service Provider whom will help them maintain their ELT title files.

In January 2015, the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles and eDS began the development of an Electronic Lien and Title (ELT) program, revolutionizing the current title process in Nevada. The ELT program promises to bring modernization to an out dated paper title practice, that many States are beginning to phase out, by allowing for the electronic transmission of title information and the electronic release of lien once a loan has been satisfied.

Nevada ELT will convert many current day practices to electronic processes in order to provide lenders with the most up to date information on their titles, making the program unique among many of the existing programs in the US. Included will be a Title Demand Notification, which will allow the State to electronically notify the lender when a change will occur on an ELT title because of a court order, lien sale or error.

Also available to lenders participating in the program is an inquiry function. With the rollout of ELT, all participating lenders can request through their service provider a title inquiry, registration inquiry, or title & registration inquiry which will provide them with current information on their ELT titles in a PDF form.
